

# Fast Facts: Reproductive Health and Family Planning in Gloucester County

- **1,189 cases** of bacterial sexually transmitted diseases in 2015<sup>1</sup> - a **77.2 percent increase** since 2009<sup>2</sup>
- **5.8 percent increase** in the number of breast cancer cases among all Gloucester County women since 2009 - compared to a **8.7 percent increase** for Black women and a **57.1 percent increase** for Latinas<sup>3</sup>
- **443 people** living with HIV in Gloucester County in 2015<sup>4</sup>
- **12,820 women** in need of publicly funded contraceptive services and supplies, a **4 percent increase** since 2010<sup>5</sup>
