## BILLS SCORED

**S2277/A3492: Makes FY 2017 supplemental appropriation of \$7,453,000 to DOH for family planning services.** This legislation would restore vital funding for family planning services across New Jersey, including lifesaving cancer screenings, birth control, and testing and treatment for sexually transmitted diseases including HIV/AIDS. **A YES vote is a vote for reproductive health.**

**S1017/A1963: Provides Medicaid coverage for family planning services to individuals with incomes up to 200 percent of the federal poverty level (FPL).** This program would allow thousands of women to have coverage for their reproductive healthcare needs and bring coverage to parity with the state's pregnancy eligibility level for Medicaid. **A YES vote is a vote for reproductive health.**

**S2476: Provides Medicaid coverage for services to treat and prevent Zika virus infection and associated health outcomes.** Family planning is the primary strategy recommended by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to reduce Zika-related pregnancy complications. This bill will ensure that New Jersey women can access the care they need to prevent Zika complications. **A YES vote is a vote for reproductive health.**

**VOTE HISTORY:** Senate Health, Human Services, and Senior Citizens Committee (9/8/16)\*:

**Centennial Resolutions: Commemorates 100th anniversary of founding of Planned Parenthood.** This ceremonial resolution honors the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the first Planned Parenthood health center, founded in Brooklyn on October 16, 1916. **A YES vote is a vote for reproductive health.**

**VOTE HISTORY:** Senate (no bill number) (10/20/16): Yes 27 - No 6 - NV 2 - Abstain 5  
Assembly (AR182) (10/20/16): Yes 48 - No 18 - NV 9 - Abstain 5

**A2297: Requires health insurance coverage for contraceptives to include prescriptions for 12 months.** For birth control to be effective, consistency is essential. Dispensing a 12-month supply of birth control at one time reduces a woman's odds of having an unintended pregnancy by 30 percent, among other benefits. **A YES vote is a vote for reproductive health.**

**SCR78: Commemorates women's access to reproductive health care and annual anniversary of Supreme Court ruling in *Roe v. Wade*.** For more than forty years, the U.S. Supreme Court has affirmed that under *Roe v. Wade*, the constitution protects every woman's right to make her own personal medical decisions about abortion. This resolution supports a woman's right to safe, legal abortion care. **A YES vote is a vote for reproductive health.**

Assembly (12/19/16): Yes 45 - No 21 - NV 10 - Abstain 4

**S992: Strengthens protections against employment discrimination and promotes equal pay for women.** Equal pay is both an equal rights issue and an economic issue. With a growing number of New Jersey women responsible for supporting their families, pay equity is not only a matter of justice for themselves, but also a matter of economic security for their families. **A YES vote is a vote for gender equity.**
